'We are keeping our options open, whether to establish partnerships with the companies or acquire them. It would depend on the potential and need.

"For our upstream business, we chose Asia and Africa as our new hubs because we want to capitalise on the growing consumption rate in the two regions," he told a press conference after the company's annual general meeting, here, yesterday.

Sheikh Awab said MSM will embark on agressive efforts in expanding its downstream segment, which comprises sugarcane planting and processing raw materials to produce sugar.
